weapons. This was quickly stopped, concentrated fire by the divisional and corps artillery  
and a lively aerial bombardment playing an effective part."  
"Meanwhile, however, on March 2nd the corps again failed to reach its assigned  
objectives, and in the evening, after slow progress, it consolidated its position on the  
heights --"  
"The IInd Corps thus resumed its advance -- arrived in the evening with the 'Gavinana'  
Division at Chessad Abahò; the 3rd Eritrean Brigade and the native irregular group at  
Coietzà; and the 'April 21st' Division in positions at Af Gagà; but it did not succeed in  
regaining contact with the enemy, who disappeared rapidly."

- 1989 During the night of 14 February 1989 TPLF forces started offensive operations in three  
directions of which one was Qoyatsa. The rebels intercepted the battalion stationed at

Qoyatsa, destroyed it and managed to occupy Qoyatsa. From there they effectively shelled the command centre of the 120th brigade.
