Carmela Lutmar is Lecturer in the Division of International Relations in the School of Political Sciences at the University of Haifa. She has been a Postdoctoral Research Associate in the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University (2005-2008). She has conducted research on Domestic Political Shifts and Violations of Peace Agreements supported by the Israeli Science Foundation.

She holds a BA in Political Science and Philosophy from the University of Haifa, MA in Peace Studies from the University of Notre Dame, and a PhD in International Relations from New York University (2004). Her research interests focus on leaders, leadership changes, mediation in civil wars with special interest in Africa, durability of peace agreements in interstate and intrastate wars, and institutional design and governance in war torn societies.

She has recently co-authored *Regional Peacemaking and Conflict Management: A Comparative Approach*, Routledge (with Benjamin Miller), a book on *Peacebuilding in the Asia Pacific* (with James Ockey, under contract at Palgrave), and *Leadership Changes and Regional Stability in the Middle East* (with Lesley Terris, under contract at Rowman and Littlefield). Her publications have appeared in *Peace Economics, Peace Science, and Public Policy, Negotiation and Conflict Management Research, and International Interaction*. She is currently working on a book on turning points in foreign policy, a project on comparative military occupations, and the project on the militarization nexus in Africa.
